Greetings Musherers, yes it's back again – The Origin 2010 now being held at Naseby Forest. Naseby is a wonderful location, with nice & cold temperatures during the winter! You can even fit in a spot of curling or ice-skating! We will be holding the following events:

Sanctioned Events: *(NZFSS Sanctioning Applied For)*

- Rig Race:** 2, 3, 4, & 6 Dog Sprint
2 & 3 Dog Freight
Two heats of 7 - 8km approx (Sat pm, Sun am)
- Scooter Race:** Single Dog, Single Dog Freight, Two Dog Scooter
Two heats of 4.5 - 5km approx (Sat afternoon & Sun am)

Non Sanctioned Events:

- Junior Single Dog Race – 1km
Veteran Single Dog Race – 1km (dogs must be 8 years of age or older to enter and not have entered any of the sanctioned events run over the weekend)
Bike-joring & Canicross – 2.75km approx

Trail Description:

The tracks are typical forestry roads of shingle base with some sections of grass/pine needles. The trails vary from flat sections to undulating with the odd hilly bit. Final course selection and distances are subject to conditions and availability on the day.

Accommodation:

Entrants are responsible for booking their own accommodation. There is a variety of reasonably priced accommodation available in Naseby; the main choice of most entrants will be the Larchview Holiday Park. See the attached sheet for accommodation options. It would be advisable to book accommodation as early as possible!

Meals:

A brunch is available on Sunday morning. In order to keep the weekend as low costing as possible dinner will not be provided on Saturday night, however, there are various Taverns/Cafes/etc in Naseby and surrounding areas all with reasonably priced meals

Please Note the following:

- *The above race times are approximate and also dependant on temperature.*
- *Head light and tail light are mandatory equipment for the Rig Races, and advisable for Scooter races.*
- *Draw for all classes will be in class order, subsequent heats will be done in finishing order from the first heat.*
- ***As a requirement of our Safety Plan and Forest Permit, Helmets are Compulsory for all Races.***
- *Dog Class Changes will only be accepted up until half an hour before the Mushers Meeting ie, 12.30pm on Saturday 26th June. These can be made on site to Sarah Campbell or in advance by email: howlingheights@xtra.co.nz or phone (03) 4679496 or 021313481.*
- *Proxies: If you are unable to attend the Mushers Meeting on Saturday, you must appoint a Proxy to draw your bib. Proxies must be notified to howlingheights@xtra.co.nz or phone (03) 4679496 or 021313481 by Friday 25th June 2010.*
- *All vehicles entering the forest must carry a 1kg dry powder fire extinguisher*
- *Start intervals will be 1 minute for rig, 30 seconds for scooter class.*
- *Entry into the Naseby Forest is via Fennessy Road (go past the saw-mill). Vehicles may only go where directed to race start areas.*

ABOUT NASEBY:

Historic Naseby has remained unchanged for more than half a century. It nestles in a shallow valley in the foothills of the Mt Ida Range surrounded by forest and tree-clad hills, 2000 feet above sea level. The plain is ringed by several impressive mountain ranges and it is a region that can be very hot in summer and invigoratingly cold in winter. The village is about 45 minutes drive from Palmerston, 55 minutes drive from Alexandra, and about 2 hours drive from Wanaka and Queenstown.

Alisons Cottage

Sleeps 8, two double rooms and a twin room plus very nice sleep out with bunks just out back door. Has dining room, lounge with tv, log fire, heaters, sliding doors looking out to front lawn. Nice modern kitchen with microwave, dish drawer, oven, fridge freezer. All linens supplied. Rate is \$140 for two then \$40 each extra adult and \$20 for children. Linen fee \$30.00

Barbs house

Sleeps 6; two doubles and a twin Large sunny lounge, tv, log fire. Washing machine, linen supplied. Good kitchen, well equipped, fridge/freezer. Sunny deck with great views over Naseby, private section. The twin bedroom is upstairs. Rate \$130 for two then \$30 each extra adult and \$15 for children. Linen fee \$30.00

Benjamins house

This is like stepping into the Waltons era, sleeps 8, two doubles and two twin rooms. Log fire, coal range which is what heats the water, don't be put off by this because once you have it going its easy. Lounge has comfy seating with tv and stereo, opens out to garden area. Large lawns and really private. Close to swimming dam and water races for walks and biking. Shower over bath, linen provided. \$100 for two then \$20 each extra person, \$10 kids. Linen fee \$30.00

Bessies house

Sleeps 6, 2 doubles and a twin room. One of the oldest cottages in Naseby. Set on Leven st opposite the town hall so its very central. Simple kitchen with small bench top oven, good fridge/freezer, coal range and fire place. Shower over bath with vanity inside but toilet is outside in porch area. Very cute place with nice atmosphere. TV and radio. Linen supplied. \$100 for two then \$20 each extra. Linen fee \$30.00

Ballarat ave

Three bedrooms, two doubles and a room with three single beds. Pot belly fire. Extra heaters. Good lounge with sunroom. Fully equipped kitchen. Shower and bath. Rate \$120 for first two then \$30 each extra. Private section. Linen fee \$30.00

Browns Cottage

Sleeps 8-10 ; two doubles and two twin rooms, also a sofa bed in dining area Great lounge with TV, log fire, heat pump Good kitchen, large dining area Two toilets and full bathroom Washing machine All linen provided Private yard Rate; \$140.00 for two \$30 each extra adult, \$20 for children. Linen fee \$30.00

Dicksons house

Situated opposite the childrens play ground and domain. It has three bedrooms, a double room, bunk room and then another bunk room with a double bed and single bunk above. Sleeps 7. The bathroom is outside under the large porch area with a shower and toilet and laundry facilities. The lounge/kitchen area have all the requirements, a tv and good log fire. Rate \$110 for two then \$20 for extra adults and \$15 for children Linen fee \$30.00

Turnstone

Turnstone is a 3 bedroom mud-brick cottage built during the Naseby gold-rush. It has been extended and lovingly restored over the last 10 years. It sits on the edge of Naseby overlooking the mountains, surrounded by beautiful gardens and complete privacy. Amenities include a fully equipped kitchen with dish drawers, large lounge with wood fire [TV with free view, DVD player], dining room that seats 10. 3 bedrooms [king bed, queen bed- both are hand made Dream Wool mattresses and two single beds], bathroom has tub, shower and washing machine. Out side you will find covered porches and patio area with barbecue. Rate \$145 for two then \$40 each extra. (children 12 and over) Linen fee \$30.00

Claire's place

Sleeps 8; double room, double room with extra single bed, twin room and another little room with a single bed. Linen supplied. Lovely mud brick house built in the 1880s, in the very centre of town Good kitchen, fridge but no freezer. Washing machine is in store room outside. Great dining room and separate lounge. Small courtyard, no lawn area. Pot belly fire Rate; \$140.00 for two then \$30 each extra adult and \$15 for children. Linen fee \$30.00

Hollebons House

This house is two units that can be rented as one or separate with the centre bedroom being used by either side; sleeps 16 Bottom unit has a double room and a room with four single beds Lounge with pot belly and TV. Toilet, shower and washing machine Kitchens fully equipped, linen supplied. Centre unit sleeps 3 singles, can be booked by either unit. Top unit has a double room and a room with two doubles and a single bed. Bathroom has bath/shower, toilet ,Lounge has TV, pot belly \$30 per adult & \$15 per child. Linen fee \$30.00

Fastiers House

Sleeps 8; twin room and double room and in sleepout theres two sets of bunks. Good lounge, open fire,dining table Good kitchen, fridge freezer, microwave etc Nice sunny front section Private cul de sac road close to swimming dam Rate; \$100 for two then \$20 each extra adult and \$15 for children All linen supplied for rooms inside but would be best that sleeping bags or extra linen is brought for the bunks in the sleepout.. Linen fee \$30.00

Glenys' House

Glenys' place has 2 x double bedrooms plus a "kids room" that has 2 x single beds with trundles,+ a set of bunks (sleep 6 kids), there is also a divan that folds down in case of emergency in an alcove off the hall. All the usual features, kitchen, living room and bathroom. Rate \$100 for first two then \$20 each extra adult and \$15 per child. Linen fee \$30.00

Jans place

Three double bedrooms Large warm lounge with log fire, TV, comfortable leather couches, old double hung windows north facing. Two bedrooms have a log fire that heats both rooms. Brand new kitchen fully equipped, dining table. Sun room that opens out to front garden. Linen supplied Trampoline, plenty of games and videos for children Five minutes walk to curling rink,skating rink and luge Rate \$140 for two then \$30 each extra adult and \$15 for children. Linen fee \$30.00

Mosebys

This place has a huge garden lawn area, The house has three bedrooms, one double with en suite, two sets of bunks and a double bedroom through the garage storage area. Good kitchen and dining area with lounge off these rooms with log fire. Linen supplied. \$120 for two then \$20 each extra adult and \$15 for children. Linen fee \$30.00

Simpsons House

Sleeps 7; two double rooms and a sleep out that sleeps three. Great lounge and kitchen with log fire. Nice warm house. Bathroom has shower/bath. Linen supplied. Swimming pool, trampoline Washing machine. Fenced sunny section. Rate\$120 for two then \$20 each extra adult and \$15 for children Linen fee \$30.00

31 Strode Avenue

Sleeps 10; double room, three single beds (one set bunks), two single beds with trundle beds underneath, single sunbed in lounge. Lounge has log fire, TV Kitchen fully equipped. Linen supplied Very private , quite steep driveway. Rate \$120 for two then \$20 each extra and \$15 for children. Linen fee \$30.00

Stewarts House

Sleeps 12; two twin and two doubles upstairs, downstairs two twin rooms. Large living area with log fire, sliding doors that open on to large verandah , TV, log fire. Mod kitchen with gas heating. Power shower. Linen supplied Rate \$120 for two then \$20 per extra adult and \$15 for children Linen fee \$50.00

Weirs house

Situated up near the swimming dam this house has a double room, another double room with a single bed then a room with three single beds plus a roll out couch. It has a large deck that gets all day sun. Its a two storey house, small lounge dining area but theres another lounge area downstairs. Heating is a log fire. Good kitchen with all you need. Linen is supplied , fee \$30.00 \$120.00 for the first two then \$20 each extra.

Ziggys House

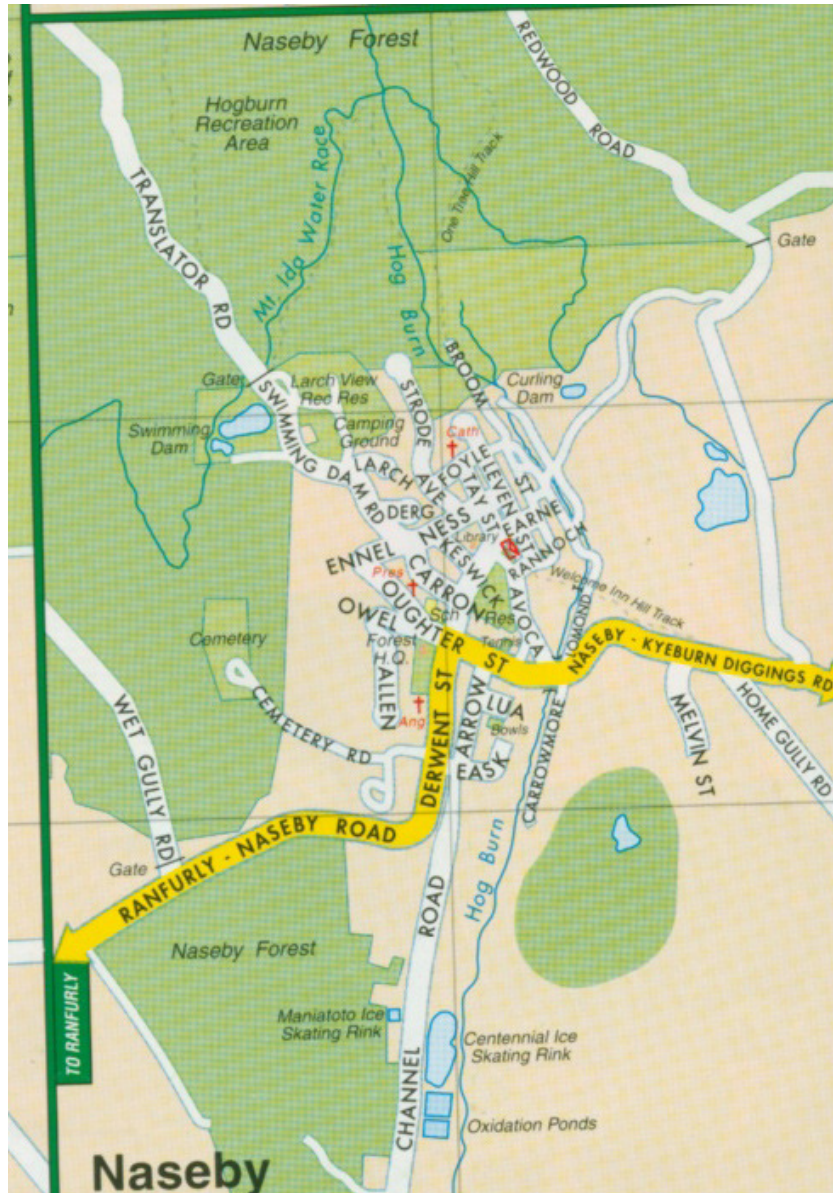
Sleeps 6; double room and twin room upstairs and a double bed in the sleep out. This A frame house house is on a great section, very sunny. Small log fire heats the whole house easily. Small but compact. Shower and toilet Linen supplied, Linen fee \$30.00 Playground 50 yards away Rate; \$90 for two then \$20 each extra adult and \$15 for kids.
